Chairman's Report

I am pleased to report that during 2008, the Association completed the project undertaken under the Task Force on Gemstones put together by the Hong Kong Accreditation Service of the SAR. In March the new Hong Kong Diamond Testing Standard was launched; it followed the Fei Cui Standard published in 2006. Once again this was the harvest of many months of hard work by the Diamond Testing Standard working group led by Irene Leung, and was the final step of the project 'Trustmarking Hongkong into an International Jadeite Jade and Diamond Jewellery Trading Centre: Establishing a Gem Testing Laboratory Accreditation System for Jadeite Jade and Diamond Jewellery in Compliance with the International Standard ISO/IEC 17025' granted by the SME Development Fund and implemented by the Hong Kong Productivity Council.

It is 100 years since it was first agreed, in England, that the jewellery trade had a need for its members to be properly educated in the ever increasing complexities of gemmology. The decision to set up gemmological courses resulted in the birth of what was to become Gem-A, which would in its turn give birth to GIA and many other centres of gemmological educational excellence. GAHK was happy to participate in Gem-A's HK celebration of this event in September and feels that it is an anniversary that we all share, regardless of Alma Mater.

A gratifying number of Association members have qualified to be Certified Gemmologist, (Fei Cui) and or (Diamond) – CGs. The first CGs (Diamond) were registered in May this year. To apply for this CG qualification, members must prove that they have fulfilled the CPD (Continuous Professional Development) study requirements. This programme is under the supervision of Johnson Li and Edward Liu, the Education Directors and their team. It is going very well with most of our members delighted to have the opportunity of updating their skills regularly in order to keep up with the ever changing/innovating techniques and advances in the world of gemmology.

On May 12th North Western Sichuan was rocked by devastating earthquakes, resulting in tragic loss of life, homes and businesses for many people. There was a great response from around the world as people gave generously to help those affected and the suggestion was made that some of our members might wish to contribute through a fund set up by GAHK. This was willingly taken up and acknowledgement is made of those members who contributed to the GAHK Sichuan Earthquake Relief Fund on page 2 of this journal.
